

KEY FACTS

Hauraki Deed

- 96% ratification of the Hauraki Deed only equals 152 people who voted in March 2017
- More than a 150 people were at the Manukau Hui-a-Iwi in Oct 2018 who said 'don't sign the Hauraki Deed until the independent report is received and actioned.

Boards working together

- The Trust Board and Iwi Trust are working together
- Both the Iwi Trust and the Trust Board opposed the signing.
- Other Iwi and Crown officials are trying to destabilize Ngati Paoa governance.

Hau Rawiri is NOT a mandated Negotiator

- 6 May 2018 Hau resigned as a Negotiator.
- 10 May 2018 Trust Board accept Hau's resignation
- 10 Nov 2018 Hau attempts to be re-elected as a Negotiator with no notice, no returning officer, no facilitator, no independent observers and no support from the Trust Board.
- 18 Nov 2018 Iwi member makes an official complaint with OTS about Hau's election on 10 Nov 2018 as illegal, unconstitutional and in breach of the Deed of Mandate.
- 13 Feb 2018 Leah Campbell makes a discretionary decision to reinstate Hau as a Negotiator without following the Deed of Mandate, without consultation and without notice, without support from the Trust Board as the Mandated Entity.

Morehu Wilson qualified his mandate

- 26 October 2018 Morehu sends a letter to the Minister stating he is guided by the Iwi who said don't sign the Hauraki Deed until after the Independent Report is received and actioned.

Signing can wait.

- In 2012 Ngati Paoa decided not to sign the Tamaki Deed until an issue with the Deed was resolved.
- In 2018 Ngati Paoa decided not to sign the Hauraki Deed until an independent report is received and actioned.
